July 2004 Club Meeting Minutes

President Gary Dagan opened the meeting at 7:45 PM at Bowen Scarff FORD on Friday, July 9, 2004.

Secretary Report, Cecil Paoletti. The minutes for the June meeting were accepted. The minutes were published in the PEGASUS.

Treasurer's Report: The club treasurer was traveling. Gary Dagan reported that the club was solvent and that the club insurance had been paid.

Chris Johnson introduced his son Derick, who was on leave from his MP duties in Iraq. He is with the 66th Military Police Co. and stationed in a little town just south of Baghdad. Sgt. Johnson has been in the army for three years and returns to Iraq on the 16th of this month. He noted that he still has about 7 months duty in Iraq remaining. Sgt. Johnson reported that his organization was very well equipped. He noted that the air conditioned Hum Vee's operating in Iraq are able to reduce the vehicle temperature to about 95 degrees F when the exterior air temperature is 134 degrees F. Sgt. Johnson has frequent contacts with the Iraqi general public and reports the public attitude toward him is very positive. He said the Iraqi's call our president "Poppa Bush." He mentioned several atrocities Saddam Hussein had committed against the Iraqi people, and that they were glad to be rid of him. Sgt. Johnson went on to say he thought most of the ordinary Iraqi's were ready to stop fighting and want to get rid of the troublemakers. He noted that some religious leaders are paying unemployed Iraqi's to shoot at "Soft targets." Sgt. Johnson's job is the training and equipping of the Iraqi police force. He noted his platoon has 32 members and is in charge of 12 police stations. There was a recent "Weapons buy back" program where, for example, an AK-47 was worth \$100 or an RPG was worth \$150 if turned in to the MP's. The program netted them several very large containers of military ordnance. Sgt. Johnson's work brings him into contact with military forces from several other nations and he particularly praised the troops from El Salvador as being very valiant. He was not as enthusiastic about the Spanish troops who recently vacated Iraq at the order of their government. Sgt. Johnson noted that the morale of our troops was high; they were well equipped and well fed. He noted their lunches

typically consisted of such American regulars as pizza, corn dogs, and French fried potatoes. Their dinners consisted of chicken, steak, or crab legs typically. Sgt. Johnson noted that the Iraqi children needed simple things like school supplies and recreational equipment. Our government provides our troops with access to satellite phones, about 15 minutes per GI per week. The cost for non-government provided phone service is \$1 per minute. He noted that they can use AT&T pre-paid phone cards. Sgt. Johnson expressed his appreciation for our collection of items for the GI's and for the Iraqi children, and he assured us these items will be put to very good use. He was a very impressive young man that we can all be proud of. Gary Dagan spoke for all of us when he expressed his appreciation for what Sgt. Johnson and his compatriots were doing for our country.

Tours and Events, Margaret Petersen: The July Dinner Night Out activity will be held at the Japanese Steak House near South Center. We should meet there at 6:30 PM.

The tour to Mt. St. Helens on June 26 had really great weather and was enjoyed by those who attended. The group really appreciated the park ranger who acted as a tour guide. We had 11 cars at Pacific Raceway for the SOVERN event. Unfortunately there was an incident on the track that prevented the usual parade laps everyone enjoys. Some unfortunate person damaged their car and scattered parts and oil on the track preventing the parade laps.

There is an opportunity to tour the "Lemay" museum on the last Saturday in August. This is a highly recommended experience and only costs \$5 for a ticket.

Plans continue for a club tour to "Hot August Nights" in Reno, NV, next year. Make your plans because it will soon be time to make reservations for lodging.

Preparations for the annual Bowen Scarff car show, 8/21, are in full swing. The parking team will start the setup at 6:00 PM on the Friday before. Items are still needed for the "Goodie Bags", 100 of each item would be appreciated. The bags will be filled on 08/19 at the April's. There will not be any "Host Cars" this year. The trophies are still to be determined.
