July 17th

PCMC planned a run to Crater Lake for almost a year. *We owe Margaret Petersen a big thanks for organizing the Cruise!* Three cars and a truck made the run: Bruce and Margaret Petersen's 98 Cobra convertible, Gary and Linda Hallberg's 97 GT (it's Linda's car), Cecil and Jo Paoletti's Ranger pick-up and Tom and Linda Rowley's 05 GT convertible.

The Petersens, Hallbergs and Rowleys met in Fife, on Friday morning, for breakfast at Mizel's. We drove down I-5, with a couple stops, without incident and met the Paolettis in Salem, Oregon for lunch. We met at the Rock-n-Rogers Drive-In just off I-5. It is a retro Drive-In with a Pink Caddy on top of its sign. Nice place, good service and food.

After lunch we continued down I-5 to Sutherland, Oregon and stopped at the White Horse Coffee Shop. It was closed, but the owners were still there and opened just for us. We arrived at Crater Lake National Park about noon and got our first look at the lake. This is a lake formed by a volcanic explosion of Mt. Mazama about 7700 years ago. The lake is the crater and the dome is an island. This is the deepest (1943 Feet) and clearest lake on the US, maybe the world. We spent the remainder of the day driving around the lake, with a lunch stop. The altitude at the rim of the lake is 7300 feet. We did a side trip to The Pinnacles along the way. They are lava tubes formed by lava flowing out 7000 years ago and the soil around them being eroded away over time leaving the tubes.

We drove back to the B&B on the same route and arrived too late to get dinner anywhere close, so we had what we had for dinner. Things close at 9 p.m. We had another nice sunny day.

After breakfast on Sunday we set out to look at the best of the waterfalls, the colliding rivers and a covered bridge.

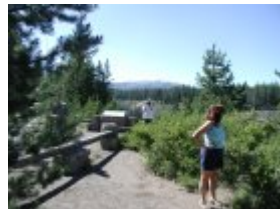
