**Secretary's Report:** June 2009 minutes were approved as written.

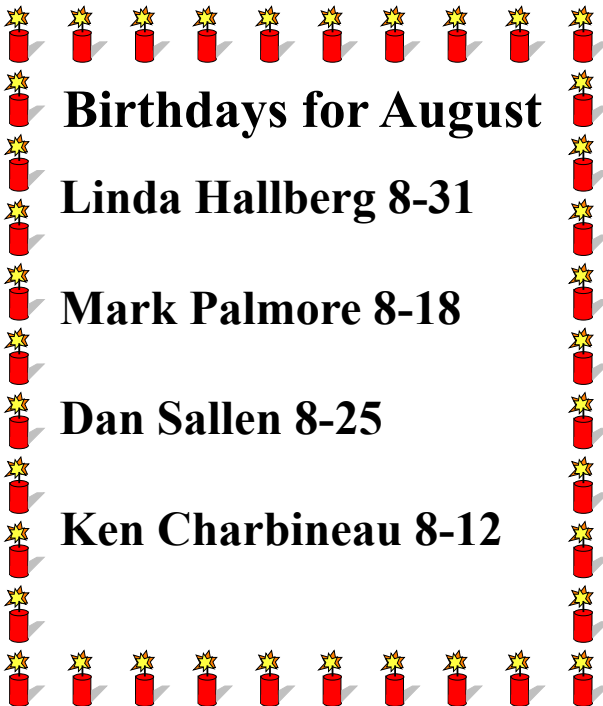
