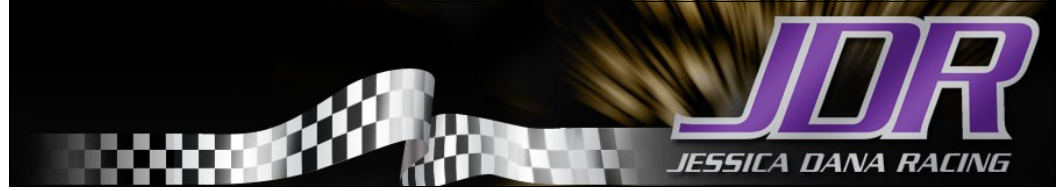

Jessica began riding ATVs when she was 4 and racing them at 8.

Two months after sitting in a go-kart for the first time she finished in the top-5 at the 2009 Indoor Kart Championships. The youngest female ever to race in the prestigious Miller 200 at South Sound Speedway in Tenino, Wash., the 17-year old finished 11th after starting deep in the field. Over a one-month period in the spring of 2010, Jessica took part in charity kart races and beat both 4-time NASCAR champion Jeff Gordon and extreme motorsports start Travis Pastrana.

### *New road-racing track in Shelton draws high praise from initial users*

SHELTON – The Ridge Motorsports Park, the first purpose-built road-racing track built in Western Washington in decades, will be ready for racing pending approval by SCCA later this year. In a note posted on Jan.5 on [www.ridgemotorsportspark.com/news](http://www.ridgemotorsportspark.com/news) track organizers said they had finished installing curbs around the 2.4-mile track, runoff areas were being groomed for seeding and the storm-water system was being installed. The Northwest Region will have its first event at The Ridge, a Double Regional, on April 14 and 15, with SCCA's certification.

The Northwest Region has scheduled five Tire Rack Street Survival classes in 2012. Three

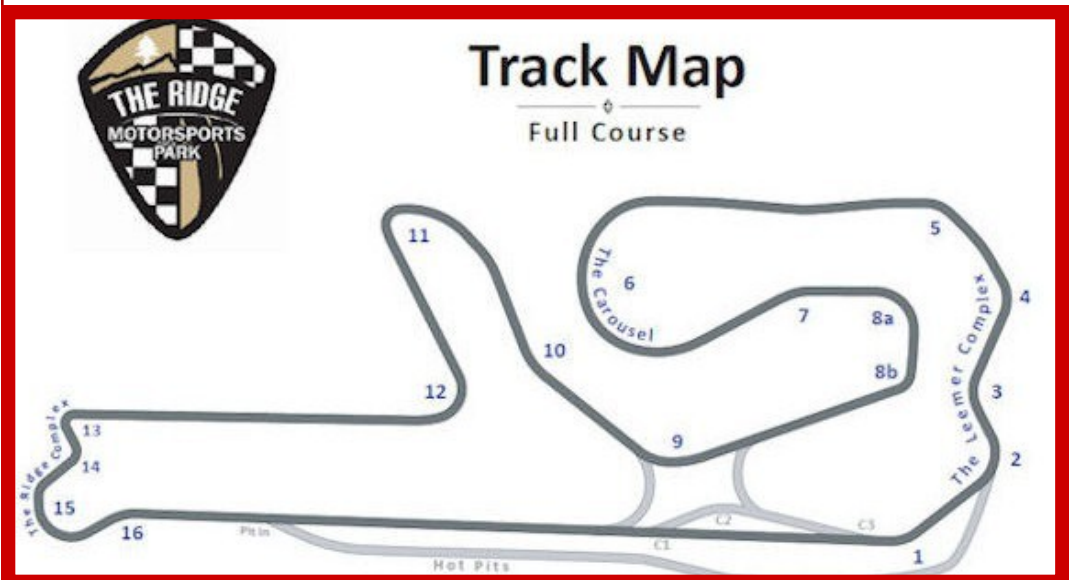
sessions are specifically for teenagers and two are for adults. Tire Rack Street Survival teaches

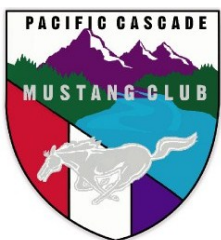

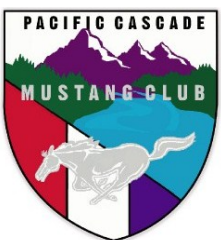
