October 2004 Club Meeting Minutes

President Gary Dagan called the Business Meeting of PCMC to order at 7:38 PM.

Treasurer's Report: The club treasurer, Gary Hallberg, reported the club's participation in the sponsor's, Bowen Scarff FORD, August car show was very successful for the club's finances.

Secretary's Report: Linda Hallberg replaced the club secretary for the October meeting. The meeting minutes were amended, the annual club dues were shown as \$20.00 whereas the actual annual dues are \$25.00. The minutes were approved as amended.

Tech. Committee: Gary Dagan has now acquired the part necessary to repair the parking brake mechanism in Linda H's Mustang. A tech session will be scheduled to install the part. Call Brad Hoffman, the Tech. Committee chairman, if you have an idea for a tech session and want to schedule it. The membership discussed ideas for winterizing our Mustangs for extended storage. Some suggested items were,

- Drain coolant (be sure to drain the block and heater core also).
- Either replace coolant with 50/50 mix of fresh antifreeze and water or determine the freezing point of the installed coolant to be sure the engine is protected from freezing.
- Be sure the gas tank is full to minimize water condensation.
- Add a fuel stabilizer to the fuel tank; drive the car to thoroughly mix the stabilizer into the fuel and to distribute the stabilized fuel into the engine fuel system.
- Raise the car and support it on blocks to unload the tires and avoid the tires taking a set, flat spotting.
- Alternatively, one could drive the car occasionally, on nice days of course, to circulate the oil, lubricate the chassis, stir up the coolant, and top off the battery.

- The club President and his family are going to Mt. Rainier on the second of October and invited interested members to come along.
- The monthly "Dinner Night Out" activity will be at "Whisker's Café" in Auburn on the thirteenth. We need a head count to determine attendance in advance since the café is normally closed in the evening and the owner will open it especially for us. So far 6 have committed to attend.
