things off in a hurry. So, it was more like Hot August Days with Pleasant August Nights.

HAN is a 9-day event for showing classic cars, street rods, hot rods of any description, color and modification. Only 5000 cars are allowed to register each year with probably as many cars again that are not registered. There is currently a two-year waiting list. Ed was able to register his car for 2007. None of the PCMC cars were registered this year, so none of us got to participate in the official activities. The Sands Hotel had a lot set aside for 100 classic cars for hotel guests, which Gary and Ed got to use. The registered cars, all 1972 and older, were located at the parking lots of the Hilton, Peppermill, and Atlantis Casinos and in downtown Sparks. Each day downtown Reno and Sparks are blocked off and a show and shine is held during the day. Each night the cars cruise from 7-10 in downtowns Reno and Sparks, where several city blocks are blocked off just for the cruise. Big trucks were also part of the event, starting at 10 PM. There are many events to go along with the cars and trucks, like a Silver Auto Auction, A vendor display, swap meet, and 50s and 60s music at several locations. The numbers, variety, and quality of the cars are hard to describe. It gets to the point where you ignore the nice cars and concentrate on the spectacular ones, only. We did, of course look at ALL the Mustangs, and there were some beauties there. You have to see the event yourself to experience the sensory overload.

We did have some car trouble. Ed's fastback needed a new battery when the first new one quit working (that was on the drive around Tahoe), and a driver's window regulator replacement. Gary's 65 Convertible driver's side seat-back broke off at the pin, and the new AC installation stopped working just in time for

the trip. A very helpful local car guy, whose parents happened to stop by and inquire, volunteered him to weld the seat at his shop, which he gladly did at no cost. Gary did have to remove and re-install the seat in the parking lot in 100-degree weather, lying down on the hot pavement. The AC requires a new expansion valve, and is still under repair.

Over the weekend we all made our way home. Ed and Lori left Saturday and one-hauled it back to Seattle in a record 12 hours. Dagan's, Petersen's and Rowley's left Reno on Sunday and spent a night in Roseburg OR. The other flew home Sunday evening. Aside for a bug storm that made the car windshields look like a mustard commercial, we all had a fun and safe trip home.
